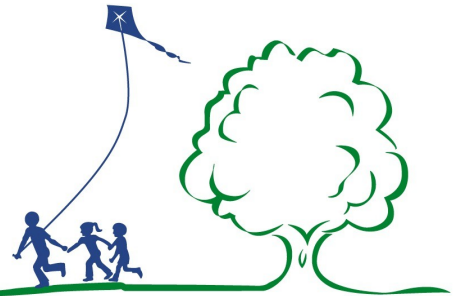

## Press Release Easter Day Fun

Warley Woods Community Trust will be holding its first ever Easter event on Easter Sunday, 23<sup>rd</sup> March.

There will be an Easter Egg roll down the meadow's long bank (called the death run in snowy weather.). If the Egg is decorated then it can also be entered into the Painted Egg Competition.

There will then be an Easter Egg Trail with clues which will lead visitors through the Woods to the Pavilion where hot cross buns and hot drinks will be available (alongside normal café fayre).

Viv Cole, Trust Manager said "We were amazed by the number of people who came to our first Christmas event this year to see Santa in the Woods. We hope the Easter Egg Event will be equally popular and that both will become part of the Bearwood Calendar, as the Picnic in the Park already is."

- Warley Woods Community Trust (WWCT) is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee. WWCT is first charity in the United Kingdom to have taken responsibility for an urban park. The organisation was formed to ensure local people had a say in what happened to their park.
- The park is leased to Sandwell MBC for 99 years and has been subleased to WWCT for the same period of time.
- It is managed by a Board of Trustees which is made up of local people. The Trust's membership now numbers around 750 individuals and there are over 70 active volunteers.
- The Park was named the People's Park after it was saved from becoming sold for housing by public subscription in 1906.
