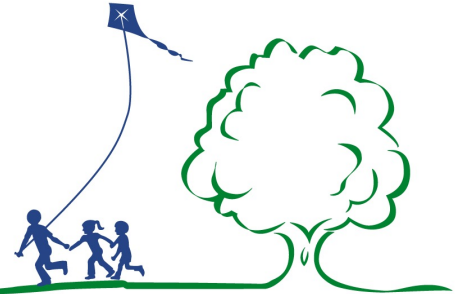

Warley Woods Community Trust will be holding its first ever Easter event on Easter Monday 5th April.

There will be an Easter Egg roll down the meadow's long bank (called the death run in snowy weather.) with prizes for the egg-roller that rolls the furthest. If you have a decorated egg, then you can enter the Painted Egg Competition.

There will also be an Easter Egg Trail with clues which will lead visitors through the Woods to the Pavilion where hot cross buns and hot drinks will be available (alongside normal café fayre) and other eggy activities.

Viv Cole, Trust Manager said "This is our third year of the Egg Roll and it has become a really popular event. Everyone is welcome to come and enjoy the fun – whether you are artistic, competitive, or just want an Easter stroll through the woods."

- The park is leased to Sandwell MBC for 99 years and has been subleased to WWCT for the same period of time.
- It is managed by a Board of Trustees which is made up of local people. The Trust's membership now numbers around 750 individuals and there are over 200 active volunteers.
- The Park was named the People's Park after it was saved from becoming sold for housing by public subscription in 1906.
